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## Reporting Update

Beginning May 11, 2009 (May 18, 2009 for GI reports) you will notice changes in our anatomic pathology report formats. The reports are designed to be easier to read, more consistent in organization, and allow you to find the information you need to treat your patients faster.

Some of the report formats will include new information designed to assist you in evaluating course of action. From new tables and graphs, to anecdotal information based on our years of experience rendering evaluations of anatomic specimens.

For example:

- Our new Urology prostate report includes:
  - Clear concise diagnosis highlighted and underlined.
  - Prostate mapping to quickly identify where cancer is or isn't.
  - Partin table available when you provide a PSA.
  - Capra scores.
  - Photomicrographs on abnormal results.
- Our new GI report includes:
  - Clear concise diagnosis.
  - Upper and lower GI tract mapping showing the area of the biopsy and our diagnosis category.
  - Photomicrographs on abnormal results.
- Our new Hematology/Oncology reports include:
  - Consistent organization. Clear and concise diagnosis and comment always in the same place.
  - Photomicrographs and Histograms (where applicable).
  - A comprehensive summary report shown on one page correlating all testing performed on the specimen after all modalities completed.
  - All report modalities followed by one pathologist who is in regular contact with the specialists reading the individual modalities.
- Our new Dermatology report includes:
  - Consistent organization.
  - Clear concise diagnosis.
  - Photomicrographs on abnormal results.
